UPDATE ON TWO ADDITIONS TO OUR CHURCH MISSIONS BUDGET: The church has assumed support for



World Vision's Yerson Edward Lopez Condori, formerly supported by the Eveready Ladies group. Yerson will be 10 yrs. old on August 30, lives with his 2 sisters and parents in Peru. His parents struggle to support the family but despite their efforts, it is difficult to meet the family's needs. His father is a construction worker, his mother is unemployed.

World Vision's work is customized to help each community overcome their unique set of challenges. Our monthly donation of \$30 is combined with those of other sponsors to ensure consistent support for Yerson and his community. World Vision starts by building relationships with local and community leaders who identify their greatest challenges and nominate vulnerable

children for sponsorship.

Then community projects begin with W.V. working with families. Excitement grows as families start experiencing positive change and the well being of children improves as solutions are adopted.

The third step (which is where Yerson's community is now) is that local leaders and families take on more ownership as self-sufficiency grows. The community and children grow stronger and healthier thanks to large improvements in areas like clean water, education, nutrition and more. <u>Putting Prayers to Action</u> You may remember the summer shoe drive the Evereadies did each year for school shoes for children of Appalachia. This organization supports families in the Appalachian mountains by meeting their physical and spiritual needs. They serve counties in the following states: Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia & West Virginia. Putting Prayers to Action is a family ministry founded by Bryan and Tina Decker. Bryan and Tina have been married since 1989 and God called them into ministry together in 2007. "God has allowed us many years of building relationships with our (*Appalachian*) families and children. Life in the mountains is hard. Many of our families have no running water or electricity. Many of our children are sick due to poor nutrition and poor water conditions. God has placed a deep love and passion for His mountain people in our hearts."
