
The holidays are coming quickly and the Missions Committee/Consistory have three ideas of ways FRC can help others to have a blessed holiday this year...

- 1. You already know about our Putting Prayers to Action project. Putting Prayers will be delivering Christmas presents to the children of disadvantaged families in the Appalachian Mountains in Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia. We will be collecting donations to send to Putting Prayers for them to buy the presents and pay for the gas to make those deliveries. There are envelopes marked for this in the church narthex. You can put your check made out to the church in the envelope (write your personal offering envelope # on the outside) and put it in the offering plate <u>no later than Oct. 22</u>. We will write a church check made out to Putting Prayers for the total given and send to them. IF you prefer writing your check to Putting Prayers to Action, it will be included in our mailing to them.
- 2. With Thanksgiving in mind and Good Shepherd Mission preparing a Thanksgiving meal for the homeless men in their facility in Paterson, we would like to help them purchase the food needed. So we will take a special offering during worship on <u>Sunday, Nov. 12</u> to send to GSM in time for them to purchase what is needed for this special meal.
- 3. And finally, we will be contacting the Fairfield police dept. asking if they know of a needy local family that needs help this Christmas with presents for their children or food, etc. We would purchase what is needed, give to the police who would deliver it. This way we can be sure the need is legitimate and assure the family of their privacy. When we have more information on this, we will forward it to you.
